# Elements

## Inspiration

The periodic table of chemical elements has seven rows, each arranged to show trends. Grouped by similarities and differences, there are sections for discovered elements, some that occur naturally, and others that are only found in trace amounts. Though seven rows has been the norm, higher atomic numbers are being pursued, and as they are added, an eighth row will be added, potentially including not just elements that have been found, but new ones that have been invented.



## **Elements**

### Concept
